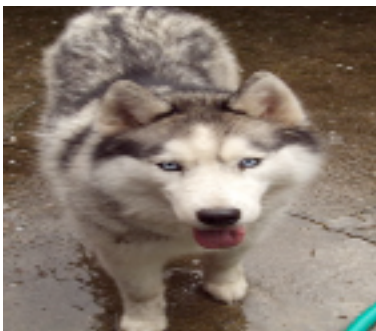


Kavik

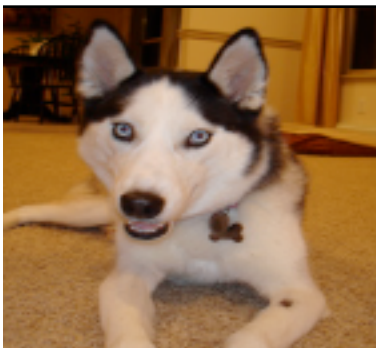


Flint
